City Prepared for Above Average Snowfall

The National Weather Service for the Twin Cities released their 2016-2017 winter outlook. The Climate Prediction Center is calling for this winter to be a typical La Nina winter. This means there is high confidence that we will see above normal snowfall with slightly colder than normal temperatures.

City staff spends many hours preparing for winter. It takes about an hour to put the plows on each of the 22 pieces of equipment. Each operator drives his routes to note areas of concern and places curb markers where it is difficult for them to see the curblines once it snows. Adjustments are also made to manholes and water valves to ensure plow edges don't catch on them.

The city will purchase 800 tons of salt and make 42,000 gallons of brine. Brine is a mixture of water, salt and molasses or sugar beet juice. This mixture is applied to streets prior to a snow event to help prevent ice from forming and allows accumulated snow to "peel up". By using brine, the City has been able to reduce the amount of salt it uses by 20% which is not only more economical, it keeps salt out of local water bodies. Too much salt or chloride is harmful to the environment.

To help expedite the removal of snow, the city has winter parking restrictions. There is no parking on any street within the city between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. from Nov. 1 until March 31. Please help us by passing this information on.



Without having to navigate around parked cars, snowplows can clear the streets quicker and clear from curb to curb. Every snow storm is different, so plowing operations are adjusted accordingly. For heavy snowfall that lasts over 12 hours, the City will use shifts to keep plows on the road to clear priority routes while snow is still falling. It may take up to 12 hours after the snow has stopped to clear city streets. For smaller storms, the City may wait until the snowfall has completely stopped in order to clear all the snow.

The City has prioritized City streets, facilities, trails, sidewalks and recreational facilities based on the function, use volume and importance to the welfare of the community.

- **Priority 1** - "Snow Plow Routes" - Major sections of the City that provide access for emergency fire, police and medical services. "High Priority Facilities" include the Fire Halls, downtown and pedestrian routes for schools and public safety
- **Priority 2** - Streets providing access to schools and commercial businesses
- **Priority 3** - Low volume residential streets and alleys
- **Priority 4** - Medium priority non-street facilities
- **Priority 5** - Low priority non-street facilities



2040 Comprehensive Plan

The Metropolitan Council of the Twin Cities requires all cities to complete or update their comprehensive plans every ten years. Therefore, Prior Lake's 2030 Comprehensive Plan that was approved in 2006 must be updated to the city's 2040 plan. Within the seven county metropolitan area, cities have designations ranging from an "urban center" to an "emerging suburban edge" community; Prior Lake has the later designation. Prior Lake's Planning Commission will play a lead role in updating the comprehensive plan in 2017 toward its submission to the Metropolitan Council in 2018. Six plan elements include: (1) land use, (2) transportation, (3) water resources, (4) parks & trails, (5) housing, and (6) plan implementation. Watch for public engagement opportunities in 2017.

The city's population is expected to grow from 25,000 in 2015 to 38,000 in 2040, or approximately 500 persons per year. This 25-year forecast by the Metropolitan Council did not change much from its previous forecast for 2030 (due to the recession). The comprehensive plan will help guide the type of growth (i.e., residential vs. commercial), the location for development, and the necessary public infrastructure to support that growth. Much of the future growth is anticipated within an orderly annexation area southwesterly of Prior Lake in Spring Lake Township.

Clearing Driveways and Sidewalks

City Code 701.100



The ordinance requires property owners to clear snow from their driveways and sidewalks adjacent to the property. This is to provide a clear path for pedestrians and children walking to school. You may have to clear the driveway a second time after your street has been plowed. **Placing, plowing or shoveling snow in the sidewalk or street is prohibited. Plowing snow across a street is prohibited.**

Clearing Fire Hydrants

The Prior Lake Fire Department requests that neighbors share in the responsibility of making fire hydrants accessible to first responders. This saves firefighters valuable time when responding to a fire at your home or within your neighborhood. A three-foot clearance is recommended.



Recreational Equipment Storage

City Code 1102.700

Recreational summer equipment should now be stored in the side or rear yard, five feet away from property lines. Winter equipment is now allowed to be parked on or adjacent to the driveway. Currently licensed and operable winter recreational equipment, including fish houses, may be parked on or adjacent to a driveway on a lot in a "R" Use District from Nov. 1 to April 1 each year. Currently licensed and operable summer recreational equipment may be parked on or adjacent to a driveway on a lot in a "R" Use District from April 1 to Nov. 1 each year. At all other times, recreational equipment shall be stored in the rear or side yard and set back a minimum of five feet from the rear or side yard.


